BUSSING

The start of the school year is always a challenge. So we wish to remind all families of a few points that are meant to keep everyone safe and the transitions quick and smooth.

- Please <u>always</u> use the sidewalk as it is the safest way to navigate through the 19 buses in the AM and PM. Not to mention setting a good example to the children.
- 2. Crossing from your vehicle to or from the sidewalk should only be at the painted lines crossing area.
- 3. Once the buses have begun to arrive at the school, no other vehicles should approach the school for either drop off or pick up either in the AM or PM.

We are a "Transfer" school and with 19-20 busses and hundreds of students, we ask all of you for your support in keeping everyone safe. Thank-you.

ATTENDANCE

Blessed Sacrament's Safe Arrival Policy states that an absence from school must be accounted for by a telephone call to the school by 8:30 am (519) 449-2984.

Attendance is taken daily by 8:45 am and by 1:20 pm. Students who arrive late in the morning, must report directly to the office for an admit/late slip and then



DANGER: BUS LOADING ZONE



Before and after school, once buses start to arrive in the school bus loading zone, please do not drive up to the school to drop off or pick up students. We would like parents to park near the crosswalk and use the sidewalk. Please do not walk between buses. This is for the safety of all students, parents and staff. Your co-operation and good example is very much appreciated.

INDOOR SHOES

While at school **all** students are expected to wear a clean pair of shoes when indoors. We recommend white soled running shoes as they can then be used for physical education class as well.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the event of weather that may affect school transportation, Blessed Sacrament is a **Zone 3** school with all Brant County schools. If bus transportation is cancelled in Zone 3 (as announced by local radio stations) Blessed Sacrament will **be closed** for students and staff. Decisions to cancel or delay transportation will be made prior to 6:30 a.m. and be announced prior to 6:45 a.m. When Blessed Sacrament School requires an emergency closing due to weather conditions, each child or family of children will only be dismissed when the parent has been contacted by school personnel and/or volunteers.

Schools back! Together, let's ensure our children arrive at school and back home, safely.

Here's some helpful tips to remember:

- 1. All vehicles are required to fully stop when children and crossing guards are anywhere in the crosswalk. That means, vehicles cannot turn left, right, or proceed through the crosswalk, even on the clear half of the roadway. You must wait until all pedestrians and the crossing guard are safely on the sidewalk before proceeding.
- 2. All school zone speeding limits are reduced to 30 km/ hour and 40 km/hour to keep children safe. The fines for
 speeding in these areas have increased and demerit points are higher.

Drivers travelling in both directions must stop for a stopped school bus when its upper red lights flashing and / or stop arm is activated. Amber flashing lights on a school bus indicate that the bus is preparing to stop. When you see these lights, it means you should slow down and be prepared to stop, as the red flashing lights and stop sign will soon be activated. If you are approaching the bus from the front, stop at a safe distance to let children get on and off the bus and cross the road safely. Don't move forward until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm is no longer activated!

Let's keep our kids safe!



STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Many families do not know that our school board does not cover accident costs!

If an accident happens, the board may be prevented from offering financial solutions to our families even if we wanted to. Student accident insurance, Insuremykids®, can mitigate your board's exposure and help you manage the loss for student injuries that occur on school property or during school activities, including extra- curricular sports.

Each year, many families are left financially unprotected when their children are injured at school, while participating in non-school activities or at home. If a student is injured, parent(s)/guardian(s) are responsible for any costs not covered by the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) or their employer's health care plan.

Please check with your provider regarding your coverage.

Most accident-related expenses are not fully covered under OHIP and some expenses like ambulance fees, casts, crutches, physiotherapy, and emergency dental care are usually not covered at all. This leaves you, the parent/quardian, financially responsible.

To help protect your family, it is recommended that you consider obtaining student accident insurance. As a convenience to you, the Board has arranged to offer student accident insurance through insuremykids®.

Participation is voluntary, but highly recommended, and the costs are to be paid by the parent/guardian. The program is available for students up to age 26.

Coverage is provided for a wide range of accidental expenses, including:
